

What we do

We work with pupils with varying needs, supporting school staff to understand the nature of SEND and how to support the pupil in the mainstream classroom.

We support pupils to achieve and succeed at school – we work with pupils, families and school staff – building friendships, boosting confidence and helping them enjoy school life.

We offer specialised training and support packages to cover all dimensions of need as outlined in the Code of Practice 2015.

Associative Membership of the British Dyslexia Association (AMBDA) and an Assessment Practising Certificate (APC) accredits us to formally diagnose Specific Learning Difficulties/Differences (SpLD), such as dyslexia and dyscalculia, and support schools to implement BDA recognised effective practices.

Specialist autism training from Priors Court (the only UK accredited providers) enables us to support schools to implement and monitor the world renowned practice of Structured Teaching incorporated within the TEACCH approach.

Working with schools to promote inclusion

Abacus is an outreach support service offering high quality consultation supporting pupils with SEND in mainstream schools. We help teachers to develop inclusive classrooms using specialised teaching strategies and clear, effective and manageable Multi-Element Plans (MEPs) or individual learning plans.

We believe that essential to effective learning is a safe, supportive and disciplined learning environment that respects:

- The rights of all pupils to learn;
- The rights of teachers to teach;
- The rights of all to be safe.

Our service supports school staff to develop detailed and effective target based plans for pupils. Abacus consultants work collaboratively with school staff and, when appropriate, other agencies to assess the pupil's needs through a functional assessment and the development of a Multi-Element Plan (MEP).



Our support packages

We offer consultation and advice personalised to casework needs as well as training programmes, 1:1/group specialist teaching and intervention support and supporting the SENCO in role. Examples of support include:
